The operating results for February 2012 are given in the table below.

In February 2012, Singapore Airlines recorded 6.8% year-on-year growth in systemwide passenger carriage (measured in revenue passenger kilometres) while capacity (measured in available seat kilometres) grew 5.4%. Consequently, passenger load factor (PLF) improved 1.0 percentage point to 76.1%. The number of passengers carried increased by 6.5% to 1.4 million.

PLF improved 1.0 percentage point as demand for flights to and from Singapore benefited from the Singapore Airshow held between 14 and 19 February 2012. This was however, partially offset by a travel lull in certain markets after the Chinese New Year holidays. The operating environment remains challenging with jet fuel prices increasing 14% over the same month last year. Passenger yields are likely to come under pressure with intense competition, coupled with recent promotional fare activities.

SilkAir's systemwide passenger carriage increased 14.4% year-on-year against 19.3% growth in capacity. As a result, PLF declined 3.2 percentage points to 73.9%. Owing to a shift in the Lunar New Year holidays from February in the previous year to January this year, PLF for the East Asia routes declined 5.3 percentage points.

Overall cargo traffic (measured in freight-tonne-kilometres) was 7.1% higher than in the same month last year, while cargo capacity increased by 6.9%. Consequently, cargo load factor in February 2012 increased by 0.1 percentage point. Cargo load factor increased for all regions, except for Europe and West Asia & Africa.
