The operating results for July 2003 are given in the table below.

Passenger traffic for July 2003 rebounded strongly from the previous months and the load factor gap against July 2002 narrowed considerably for most routes. SIA's fare promotions to encourage passengers to resume air travel and to some extent, the pent up demand contributed to the upturn. SIA's passenger carriage, however, remained below last year's numbers.

In July 2003, SIA progressively restored its capacity to various routes, but it was still 13.6% lower than July 2002. SIA will continue to add capacity as and when the demand warrants it.

Cargo capacity grew slightly in July 2003 as passenger services were gradually restored. Cargo loads declined by 2.1% largely due to the American economy which continues to be weak. The European export market has also softened considerably. The market out of East Asia was supported by good demand.
